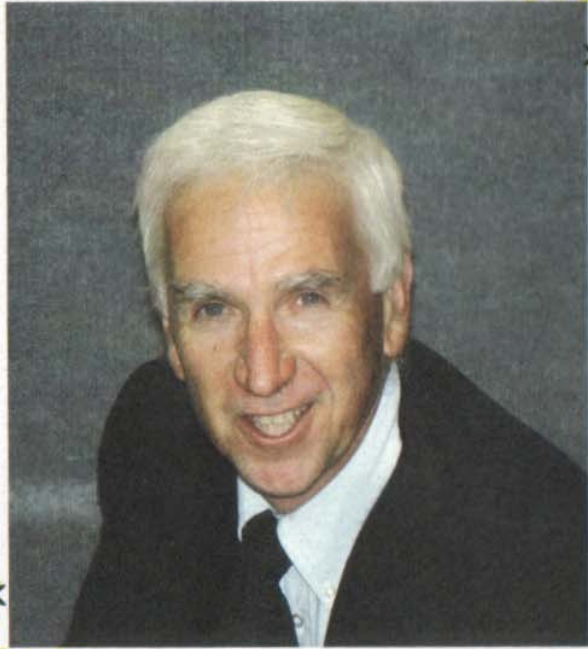


In Loving Memory

Directions from Maranatha Chapel to the Miller's Home:

Depart Coastwood Rd (east) (0.1 mi)
Turn LEFT (north) onto Camino San Bernardo (0.1 mi)
Turn RIGHT (east) onto Rancho Bernardo Rd (1.3 mi)
Bear RIGHT (east) onto ramp toward I-15 / Escondido Fwy North (5 mi)
Take ramp RIGHT toward Felicita Rd (0.3 mi)
Turn LEFT (west) onto W Citracado Pkwy (0.7 mi)
At Y in road, continue going straight
Turn RIGHT (north) onto Lemon Ave (0.3 mi)
Continue northwest on Candlelight Glen (0.1 mi)
Arrive at **1317 Candlelight Glen**, Escondido, CA 92029

Dave was born in Roseburg, Oregon to Betty and Ken Miller November 30, 1949. The Millers moved to Southern California shortly after Dave was born, and he never left — for too long.

After Dave graduated from high school and then from Long Beach State with a B.A. in Political Science, Dave married the love of his life and his Kappa Sigma sweetheart, Sue Stehle in 1971. He embarked on a short but lucrative career in selling life insurance, then bought the family store Ace Hi Liquor in Lomita a couple of years later. In 1976 his daughter Melissa Sue was born. During this tenure as store owner, Dave was invited to begin singing four-part harmony with the South Bay Coastliners Chorus and joined the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing in America in 1977.

During this time, Dave had already begun his life-long occupation of property management when he was not singing or performing. His son Jeff was born in 1980. Dave sold Ace Hi in 1985; and four years later in 1989, Dave and family moved to San Diego. He and Sue gave away their only daughter in marriage to Chris Uhles in 2000. The next year in 2001 he began building his dream house on Candlelight Glen, culminating in 2002. His first granddaughter, Kaylee Suzanna, was born in 2004 and his second, Grace Katherine, was born in 2007. The same year in May, he witnessed the marriage of Jeff to Tiffani Schwartz.

Dave and Sue went on numerous trips, frequent golfing and time-share vacations, including China and Costa Rica in 2005, Europe in 1996, Club Med-Mexico in 1992, and Hawaii twice.

Dave performed in multiple musicals, shows and community theaters. He was a member of numerous quartets, including contest-winning Splash and Confetti and volunteered countless hours with the Boy Scouts of America.
